### MORNING DROP OFF/ AFTERNOON PICK UP REMINDERS

We know that we have many families who are new to our car rider and walker drop off and pick up procedures. Here are a few reminders to make the process go smoothly and safely.

1. The pick-up and drop off area permits 5-8 cars to unload or pick-up students at the same time. **In the AM students will enter the school's side door.** Staff will greet and assist students to the side door.
2. To exit, cars will continue around the lane on the outside of the parking lot.
3. **In the PM, students will be dismissed from Pre-K door (left hand side of the building); staff will call students to their assigned cars.**
4. Your child is a walker if you park and meet them at the Pre-K door. You may request a car sign if there are days you will be in the car rider line.

### Kindergarten Registration and New 1st Grade Registration

Kindergarten registration and new 1st Grade registration, for the 2016-2017 school year, will be held February 29th - March 4<sup>th</sup> from 9:30 am to 2:30. There will be two evening registrations available on Tuesday, March 1 and Thursday, March 3 from 4pm - 7pm. Students must be 5 years old by September 1st, 2016 to register for kindergarten.

The following documentation is needed to register your child. This includes: Birth certificate, birth registration or passport, current immunization record, deed or lease to your current home, a current utility bill and photo ID of parent/guardian. Pre-K applications will be accepted beginning February 29th. Students must be 4 years old by September 1, 2016 to apply. This Pre-K program is based on income eligibility and approval needs to be granted prior to registration.
