

I am very pleased to tell you that all beginning of the year assessments are complete, and we feel we have a good handle on the areas of relative strength and weakness for the students. Your first opportunity to formally see how your child is doing so far this year is coming up next week. On Thursday, October 2nd, first quarter interim progress reports are coming home. The interim progress reports will let you know if your child's work and work habits are satisfactory or in need of improvement. Please take some time to discuss the interim report with your child and go over successes and areas for improvement.

MAP testing begins on Monday, September 29th for grades 1-5. Students will begin by taking the math assessment followed by the reading assessment. MAP testing will not impact our school-wide schedule because students will take the assessment during their designated math and reading time. DISCRETIONARY ABSENCES

According to the HCPSS Attendance Policy the only lawful reasons for student absences are: death in the immediate family, illness of the student, court summons, hazardous weather conditions, observance of a religious holiday, state emergency, and suspension. If you are planning on taking your child out of school for any other reason please fill out a discretionary absence form. The first three days of the absence will be marked as lawful/ excused, any additional days will be marked as unlawful/unexcused. DISMISSAL REMINDERS—NOTES FROM HOME

Please remember to send in a written reminder to your child's homeroom teacher <u>whenever</u> there is a change in dismissal instructions at the end of the day. Many after school activities have begun, children are staying after school, or going home early, and <u>EES needs prior written notification of change in dismissal.</u> With enrollment topping 795, we ask that parents write notes so phone calls to the front office won't be necessary. The afternoon is a very busy time of the day and we thank you for your cooperation in sending prior written notices to your child's teacher rather than calling the front office.

IMPORTANT POLICY INFORMATION

A Student/Parent Handbook 2014-2015 was sent home to every family the first day of school with important policies for parents and student to become familiar with. We would like to communicate some of these policies.

DISCRIMINATION (Policy 1010)

The Board is committed to providing an educational and work environment that is free from discrimination, fosters equitable opportunities, and values diversity and commonality. To that end, the Board prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, religion, physical or mental disability, age, gender, marital status, or sexual orientation in its educational program, including co-curricular and extra-curricular activities, and in the workplace. Furthermore, the Board recognizes its responsibility to promote the worth and dignity of all individuals through curriculum, instruction, professional development, and resource selection. Employees and third parties share responsibility for the health, safety, and general welfare of students and for contributing to an environment free from discrimination. It is a violation of this policy for any student, employee, or third party to engage in acts of discrimination in schools, school system offices, or at school-related activities. It is a violation of this policy to engage in retaliation with regard to allegations of discrimination. Violations of this policy are cumulative; subsequent offenses may affect the nature and severity of the consequences.

GRADING AND REPORTING (Policies 8010 and 8020)

The Board of Education is committed to ensuring that all students meet or exceed rigorous performance standards. Accordingly, grading and achievement information must be determined in a consistent manner and regularly reported. To students and their parents. Grading and promotion within the school system is based on the degree of success the individual student has achieved in the educational program. Decisions regarding promotion, retention and acceleration are made based on a student's performance and academic progress over the entire school year. The grading system for kindergarten through Grade 8 includes evaluation, effort, and instructional codes and/or comments. When the performance of any K –8 student is below grade level, the teacher, with appropriate participation of parents, will develop strategies and apply appropriate interventions to assist the student. The decision to retain or accelerate a student is based on a number of factors that may include but are not limited to: Academic achievement level Demonstrated progress in response to academic interventions Age of the student Previous retention Or acceleration Attendance record Parental concerns Developmental, health, and emotional factors Report card IEP or 504 Plan An elementary student who is not performing on grade level in reading and mathematics will automatically be considered for retention.
