FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL

Earlier this week I was in a kindergarten class while they were working on calendar skills and I learned that students have now been in school for over 30 days this year. That thirty-day mark is an important milestone in the school year. We are now well into the regular routines of school. First quarter interim reports came home with all students last week and the end of the month marks the end of the first marking period. Mr. Esposito, Mrs. Carter, and I have been having some excellent conversations with teachers about student progress and are very impressed with what we are seeing and hearing.

MAP Testing:

Today is the final day of our fall MAP testing. Some students will work on make-up testing next week, but a majority of students will have finished both the math and reading portions of the test by the end of the day today. We anticipate that the MAP parent report will be ready to be sent home with first quarter report cards in early November. We will have an EES MAP Information Night on Tuesday, October 21st at 6:00 PM.

Fall Into Words Parade:

We want to share with you some important information about our “Fall Into Words” parade scheduled for Friday, October 31st. The parade will begin at 10:00 AM with our 5th graders leading us.

As you design/buy your child’s costume, we ask that you avoid any costumes that perpetuate violence, have any blood, gore, scary masks, or contain any type of weapons. Props that come with costumes that are “play weapons” are not allowed in school. This includes but is not limited to toy guns, knives, swords, sickles, pitchforks, etc. We ask that everyone come with a creative word that describes the costume or outfit your child is wearing. No worries, we can help with that creative word if students are in need of assistance.

We also know that some of our families do not participate in this October parade. We will be hosting an alternate activity for those students. On October 31st we will have a regular school following the parade, so we are encouraging families to send their children to school! ATTENDANCE NOTIFICATIONS

You can now receive e-mail notifications from the family portal when your child is marked absent. First, log into your family portal account (the login id and password are the same as the emergency card system) using the attached link <http://hcpss.me/fp/>. Click on the top tab labeled “family”. Next click on the side tab labeled “notification”. Check the box under the label “subscribe” next to attendance. Please note that e-mail notifications are not sent out until 11:00.

DISCRETIONARY ABSENCES

According to the HCPSS Attendance Policy the only lawful reasons for student absences are: death in the immediate family, illness of the student, court summons, hazardous weather conditions, observance of a religious holiday, state emergency, and suspension. If you are planning on taking your child out of school for any other reason please fill out a discretionary absence form. The first three days of the absence will be marked as lawful/ excused, any additional days will be marked as unlawful/unexcused. IMPORTANT POLICY INFORMATION

A Student/Parent Handbook 2014-2015 was sent home to every family the first day of school with important policies for parents and student to become familiar with. We would like to communicate some of these policies.

STUDENT ASSAULT AND/OR BATTERY ON STAFF (Policy 9270)

In order for learning to take place, the school environment must be safe and orderly. Therefore, any assault and/or battery by a student on a school staff member is strictly forbidden. An assault may be physical, oral or written. Battery I is the unlawful touching of another person by the aggressor and battery II involves unlawful touching plus a display of blatant disregard for the safety of the staff member other Consequences for an assault violation range from suspension to expulsion. A battery I violation results in suspension of up to 45 days. A first battery II offense results in a suspension of at least 45 days and may result in expulsion. A second battery II offense results in expulsion. A student who violates this policy is ineligible to participate in extracurricular activities for the duration of a suspension.

STUDENT REPRESENTATION (Policy 2010)

The Board of Education recognizes the value of contributions of students in the regular meetings of the Board and encourages this participation by establishing the position of Student Member to the Board of Education of Howard County and by establishing the position of student representative in each high school. The Student Member is elected by a plurality of student voters in Grades 6 through 11 countywide and serves a one-year term beginning with the first regularly scheduled meeting of the Board in July. Student representatives are elected in their high schools and serve a one-year term.
