

What is a School Psychologist?

School psychologists help children and youth succeed academically, socially, behaviorally, and emotionally. They collaborate with educators, parents, and other professionals to create safe, healthy, and supportive learning environments that strengthen connections between home, school, and the community for all students. When should I contact my child's School Psychologist?

All children and adolescents face problems from time to time. Please feel free to contact Mrs. Carter (lisa_carter@hcpss.org) if any of the following concerns are interfering in your child's learning or relationships:

- Feels afraid to go to school
- Has difficulty organizing their materials, time, and/or thoughts
- Are going through a major life change (such as caregiver's divorce, move, etc.)
- Has experienced a recent loss
- Spends excess time on homework
- Falls behind in schoolwork
- Or experiences other difficult situations that have adversely impacted his/her life.

FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

As we enter into flu season, this is a reminder that good hand washing and covering sneezes and coughs with tissues and sleeves are essential steps to preventing the spread of "germs." Also, remember that despite concerns about school attendance, your children's health (and the health of other children) is most important of all. For this reason, we ask you to please:

- <u>Call the school nurse to let us know if your child is absent with a contagious illness such as strep throat, or the flu etc.</u> Please provide any documentation from your physician about diagnosis and release to return to school. (Ear and sinus infections, while often a reason for keeping a child home, are usually not contagious.)
- <u>Keep your child home if he/she has a fever of over 100.0.</u> A fever indicates that your child has an infection that could be passed to other students. If you give your child Motrin or Tylenol, the fever will, of course, disappear but he/she will still be contagious to others. <u>Children must be fever-free for 24 hours (without medication) before returning to school!</u>
- Have your children was their hands properly after using the restrooms and prior to eating.
- If the doctor prescribes medication for your child, please make sure he/she takes it as directed-which means the right amount at the right time and without missing doses.

IMPORTANT POLICY INFORMATION

A Student/Parent Handbook 2014-2015 was sent home to every family the first day of school with important policies for parents and student to become familiar with. We would like to communicate some of these policies.

PERSONAL COMMUNICATION DEVICE GUIDELINES

Students must comply with class and school rules and all relevant HCPSS Board Policies. Administration, faculty, and staff may request at any time that students must turn off and put away technology devices. Failure to do so may result in disciplinary action and possible revocation of privileges. Individuals assume full responsibility their non-HCPSS owned technology devices. This includes the device's safety, security and maintenance. Schools may designate approved personal communication device zones/times on school grounds; however, personal communication devices may not be used in bathrooms at any time. Students must obtain consent from staff and participants before taking, uploading or sharing photos, recording audio, or capturing video during the school day. Any disruption to class or other educational activity may result in disciplinary action. Privileges for personal communication devices vary according to grade level: Elementary school students are permitted to have personal communication devices in their backpacks during the school day. They must be turned off during school hours. They may use their personal communication devices before or after school hours. Students may use personal communication devices in the front office or classroom with the classroom teacher's/administrator's permission. Instructional time is defined as from the sound of the late bell to the sound of the dismissal bell.

STUDENTS ACCESS TO THIRD-PARTY APPLICATIONS

Throughout the school year, your child will have access to a number of educational online tools to enhance instruction. These engaging tools provide teachers and students a variety of ways to demonstrate their understanding and present information. Some of the online tools will enable students and teachers to enter and share digital content. While using these services, students will learn about safe and effective practices while interacting online. HCPSS has contracted with several online service providers that comply with student privacy laws, such as Google Apps for Education and Wikispaces. Additional authorized online services may be utilized for instruction. The terms of use and privacy policy details what type of data is collected and how the information is used by the service provider.
