

LAST DAY OF SCHOOL UPDATE

The last day of school was originally scheduled for June 10 on the 2014-2015 school calendar, which reserved five additional days through June 17 for inclement weather makeup. As of today, all five of those makeup days have been used, plus three additional inclement weather days. For the three additional days used, the Board of Education on March 12 voted to apply to the Maryland State Dept. of Education (MSDE) for a waiver for one inclement weather day used, and extend the school year by two more days, making June 19 the last day of school for students. **The calendar adjustment will not be final until approved by MSDE**.

Upcoming Picture Days

Our next picture session is just around the corner on April 23rd and 24th. We'll take the class group pictures and spring individual portraits. Payment for the **Class Pictures is due on "picture day".**

For the **Individual Portraits no pre-payment is required.** We'll photograph every student this year on our speculation plan. On April 23 Grades 1, 3 and 4 will take pictures and on April 24th Grades K, 2, and 5 will take pictures.

Healthy snack ideas

Fruits, vegetables, whole grains and low or nonfat dairy make good nutritious snacks for children. Here are some ideas for ways to serve these foods to your kids:

Fruits:

- Small pieces of fruit stirred into yogurt or cottage cheese
- Strawberries
- Raisins
- Grapes
- Pineapple, orange, grapefruit chunks



- Apple slices with all natural peanut butter
- Dried fruit mixes

Vegetables:

- Carrot sticks
- Celery sticks with all natural peanut butter or cream cheese
- Raw broccoli and cauliflower florets with a low-fat dip, hummus or salsa
- Cherry tomatoes

Protein:

- · Cottage cheese or ricotta cheese
- · Water-packed tuna mixed with mayonnaise on top of celery sticks or whole-grain crackers
- Yogurt topped with granola, chopped dried fruit or a spoonful of oat bran
- Almonds mixed with dried berries

Whole grains:

- Cereals or cereal bars that are low in sugar and fat, and high in fiber and protein
- Whole-grain crackers, breads or bagels

Sweets and desserts:

- · Frozen yogurt
- Juice bars
- Sherbet and sorbet

Pre-K Program Coming to EES 2015-2016

The Howard County Public School System offers a Pre-K program for children of families who meet the income eligibility criteria and who will be four years old by September 1, 2015. Applications for the 2015-16 school year are now available at the front office or on HCPSS website.

Pre-kindergarten registration is a two-step process:

- 1. Interested families must first submit an application with proof of income for review; income guidelines are similar to those used to determine Free and Reduced Meal status. This application must be reviewed by school administration.
- 2. Once approved, students can be registered by calling the front office at 410-313-5006 to schedule an appointment.
